

Shugg Award Requirements

In order to demonstrate the merit of a nominee you must provide:

A brief biography of the young person

– who is the person, what challenges do they face as a result of their disability?

A description of the outstanding achievements of the young person

– what have they done well and what barriers have they overcome to achieve success in their pursuits?

Describe how the young persons achievements can be considered to be outstanding and inspirational to others?

State what the young person's hopes for the future may be – how would the award assist the young person to further their goals?

Nominees may attach examples of their achievements.

Invites applications for the **Shugg Family Memorial Award**

What is the Shugg Family Memorial Award

This award was established by Tascare Society for Children as a memorial to the outstanding contribution to the Society by members of the Shugg family who have been actively involved in the Society for the past 75 years.

- ◇ **Dr. AW Shugg** was a founding member of the Society in 1935 and due to his continued involvement over many years Dr Shugg was awarded Life Membership.
- ◇ His son, **Mr. KW Shugg**, was also a Life Member of the Society until his passing in 2008.
- ◇ **Dr. Bert Shugg**, a prominent Tasmanian Paediatrician, continues the Shugg family's involvement and interest in the Society to the present day.

Each year since 1986 an award has been presented to a young person with disability who has demonstrated outstanding success in their personal achievements.

Tascare aims to create a positive image and promote the achievements of children and young people with disabilities.

Through the Shugg Family Memorial Award, the Society aims to bring to community attention the abilities, courage and positive attitudes that young people with disability possess.

What can the award be used for?

An amount of \$1500.00 is available to recognise the outstanding achievements of an individual young person. The award may be used to purchase goods or services which will assist in supporting the young person to further their goals.

Who can apply for the award?

Nominees must be between 15 and 30 years of age.

Nominees must be Tasmanian residents.

Nominations may be made by the young person themselves, or on behalf of the young person by someone closely associated with them.

The nomination must clearly demonstrate how the young person's achievements have been outstanding and inspiring to others.

How is the successful nomination selected?

Nominations are considered by a small selection panel, which includes a representative of the Shugg family. The successful nomination is ratified by the full Tascare Management Committee.

The decision by the Management Committee is final and cannot be appealed.

How to Nominate for the Award?

A nomination may be submitted in any format—written, audio or video recording, electronically or by any other method which can be used by the person to present their nomination

Nominations must address the award requirements.

What is required of the successful nominee?

The successful nominee must be available for presentation of their award at the AGM of Tascare Society for Children – held in November in Hobart.

When are nominations received?

Nomination period is from the 1st to the 30th September annually.

Confirmation of the successful applicant is ratified by the Management Committee early October.

All nominees will be informed of the outcome.
